**Discover Winter Wildlife in
Hyde Park's Stony Brook Reservation Sunday January 30th**

Free event hosted by Boston Natural Areas Network and MA DCR

BOSTON, MA – January 26, 2010 – Many have not visited this 475-acre woodland reservation before, but should! On Sunday, January 30, join the Friends of Stony Brook, Boston Natural Areas Network and MA DCR to explore Stony Brook's winter trails on the way to Turtle Pond and back. We'll look for signs of winter wildlife that have left their tracks in the snow as well as other evidence of animals that call Stony Brook home – the largest forested space in Boston.

Meet at 1:00 p.m. at the trailhead/parking area on Enneking Parkway across from Smithfield Road in Hyde Park, near the Connell softball fields. Participants should dress for snowy winter weather; all ages are welcome. After the 90-minute walk, all participants are invited to the nearby DCR West District office to warm up with a cup of hot chocolate. Event is free.
