The 6th annual Harvest Festival will include live music, cider pressing and tours of our demonstration vegetable garden. Gardeners can shop for hard-to-find native plants, cold-hardy seedlings, compost and City Natives honey. The Clover Food Truck will be on site for a quick vegetarian lunch or snack. Visitors can also tour the bee hives in the City Natives Apiary and participate in the Perennial Divide. The Divide is a unique way to swap unwanted plants for something new to plant in your garden. Gardeners are invited to exchange, donate or simply take home plants. Gardeners are asked to bring containers to carry their plants home. This Divide is always enormously successful and plants go fast!
