Take Beginners Paddle on Mother Brook Mill Pond June 28th

Part of the summer-long Boston Natural Areas Network Neponset River Greenway Festival

BOSTON, MA – June 17, 2009 – If you always wanted to learn how to maneuver a canoe, join Boston Natural Areas Network for a free paddle through Mother Brook Mill Pond in Hyde Park on Sunday, June 28th during one of three scheduled opportunities: 10:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m., and 12 noon. This experience is for beginner paddlers only who are interested in learning basic skills. This event is one of more than 30 free events offered as part of BNAN's summer-long Neponset River Greenway Festival through the end of August.

Participants will meet at Mother Brook Mill Pond, Knight Street, Hyde Park. Canoes, oars and safety vests will be provided. Reservations for the free instruction is required by calling BNAN at 617-542-7696 or visiting www.bostonnatural.org.

The Mother Brook was the first canal constructed in the United States, and is capable of diverting stream flow from the Charles River Basin into the Neponset Basin. There are access and trail areas, and several marsh areas, which are home to a variety of wildlife.
